Holy Eucharist—the different elements laid out on the Credence Table.

The **Credence table** contains the elements that are used in the Eucharistic celebration.
The Chalice is a goblet for drinking the wine
The Ciborium is a covered cup for holding the hosts.
Sacramental bread (Hostia), also called the body of Christ, is the bread or wafer
 The "**Host**" is the larger wafer used by the clergy,
 The "**Communion Wafers**" are the smaller pieces used to distribute to the communicants.
 The **Pyx** is for carrying the consecrated Host.
 The **Lavabo** is a bowl used to provide water for the washing of hands. It consists normally of an **Ewer** to pour water, and a bowl to catch the water as it falls off the hands
 The **Lavabo Towel** is used by the priest to dry his hands after washing them.
 The **Purificator** is a white linen cloth which is used to wipe the chalice after each communicant partakes.
 It is also used to wipe the chalice and paten after the ablutions which follow Communion.
 The **Pall** is the stiffened square card covered with white linen, usually embroidered with a cross, or some other appropriate symbol. The purpose of the pall is to keep dust and insects from falling into the Eucharistic elements.
 The **Corporal** is a square white cloth upon which the chalice and paten are placed when the Eucharist is celebrated
