We thank God for the faith, generosity and commitment with which Chaplaincy members responded with the pledges made then and in so many ways in the intervening years.





People are often surprised to learn that THE CHAPLAINCY IS THE BIGGEST IN EUROPE AND HAS TO BE TOTALLY SELF SUPPORTING

We get nothing from the Church of England or the Diocese in Europe and in fact contribute to the costs of the Church's administration, as do parishes in the UK itself. We don't get financial help from the Spanish or UK Governments or any other official bodies either.

OUR BIGGEST COST is in enabling the ministry of our Clergy. This includes stipends, pension and social security contributions as appropriate, and housing. Unlike the average UK parish the size of the Chaplaincy means that the cost of cars and travel (including for retired and visiting clergy who share in the ministry) is a significant factor.

OUR GREAT ADVANTAGE is that church premises costs are low compared with what would be needed to keep eight UK worship centres up and running.

IT'S NOT ALL ABOUT MONEY! You'll see that fundraising and social events make a very important contribution to our finances, but they also go a long way to enriching the life of the Chaplaincy and building of relationships – so "thank you" to our intrepid organizers!

AND IT'S NOT JUST ABOUT PAYING THE BILLS

We believe that living life to the full includes the opportunity for regular worship, receiving the sacraments, pastoral care, study, and ministry at the key moments of life – in joy and in sorrow too. Our ministry is offered to any and all who turn to the Chaplaincy and members of the clergy team often travel long distances to, for example, meet bereaved families and conduct funerals.

BUT THE BOTTOM LINE IS

This ministry doesn't take a break. It has to go on whether we are in Church or not. This is why we ask you to give your support to the Chaplaincy's work and witness by a pledge of regular, prayerfully considered giving. As things stand at present
